SUBJECT: Critical evaluation of information online

LESSON TOPIC: Developing research strategies for finding reliable information

DURATION: 60 minutes

LEARNING OBJECTIVE/S:

Students will develop basic research skills to effectively find and evaluate reliable information online.

Competencies acquired: ability to use basic search strategies to identify credible sources and information and assess the reliability and relevance of information.

MATERIALS/RESOURCES NEEDED:

- Module 4 (<u>https://www.digi-civis.eu/e-learning</u>)
- Access to reliable websites
- Quiz on research strategies

METHODS/TECHNIQUES:

Interactive lecture on research strategies, followed by a practical exercise where students conduct research and complete a quiz.



LESSON PLAN OVERVIEW

PREPARATION:

- Prepare a lecture on basic research strategies, including how to use age-appropriate databases and reliable websites.
- Use a quiz that tests students' knowledge of research strategies and their ability to evaluate sources.
- Select a relevant research topic for the practical exercise.

IMPLEMENTATION:

- Ask students why using reliable sources is important for research.
 Explain how accurate information impacts decision-making and learning.
- Introduce basic research strategies. Teach students how to formulate simple search queries, evaluate website credibility, and distinguish between reliable and unreliable sources.
- Students will research a given topic using the strategies and complete the quiz.
